

Romance Project Notes

What you will need to recreate this project:

- A6 card base (10.5 x 14.8cm) – white
- 10 x 14.3cm embossed satin card – pink
- Scrap of mesh approx. 7.5 x 10cm – silver
- Oval frame/dies maximum 10 x 13.5cm – white
- Scrap of luxury paper – ivory/cream
- Enclosed ‘undies’ templates – cut out
- Flower & foliage (or dies & paper scraps) – pink & green
- Enclosed ‘cloud’ sentiment – cut out (inside of black line)
- Twine – pink
- Small hole punch or piercing tool
- Card Candi or half pearls to finish



Assembling the project

If you are using dies cut out everything ready: white oval frame, pink flower layers, green foliage, & then assemble the flowers.

Using your own personal choice of adhesives, fix the pink satin embossed card centrally to the front of the base card, add the mesh to the back of the frame & trim away any excess showing at the edge of the frame. I used short lengths of double sided tape to attach mine.

Use either 3D pads or glue gel to attach the frame centrally on to the pink card, making sure that none of the pads are visible from the front.

Mount the centre of your flowers with either half pearls or ‘Card Candi’ before mounting those to the frame with 3D pads or gel glue & then insert foliage.

Add a little row of pearls or Candi down from the right hand corner of the card, as in the photograph.

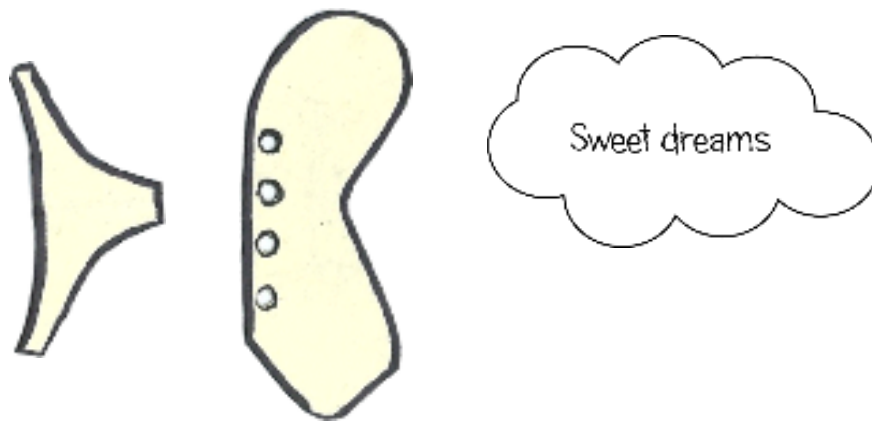
Using the ‘undies’ templates included in these project notes & your scrap of luxury paper, trace around the bodice on the reverse of your paper & then flip

the template over & create a mirror image of the first. Draw around the other part of the set & then cut all three items out.

Carefully punch/prick the holes down the front of the bodice & thread your twine through the holes to unite the two parts, & tie off in a bow.

Attach 3D pads to the reverse of both & position at an angle across the frame, as shown in the photo.

Finally, add a 3D pad to the back of the cloud shaped sentiment & attach that in the top left hand corner of your card.
