

Any size square/rectangular shadow frame

What you will need to recreate this frame:

Sheet of card - any size

Pencil

Ruler

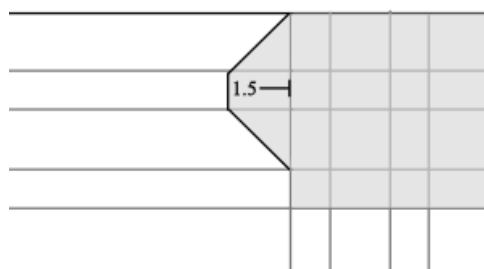
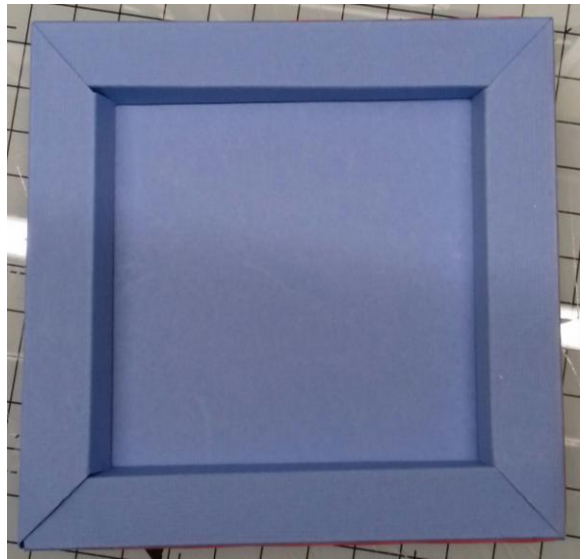
Scissors

* There are no adhesives required for this project, only a little confidence measuring.

Step by step:

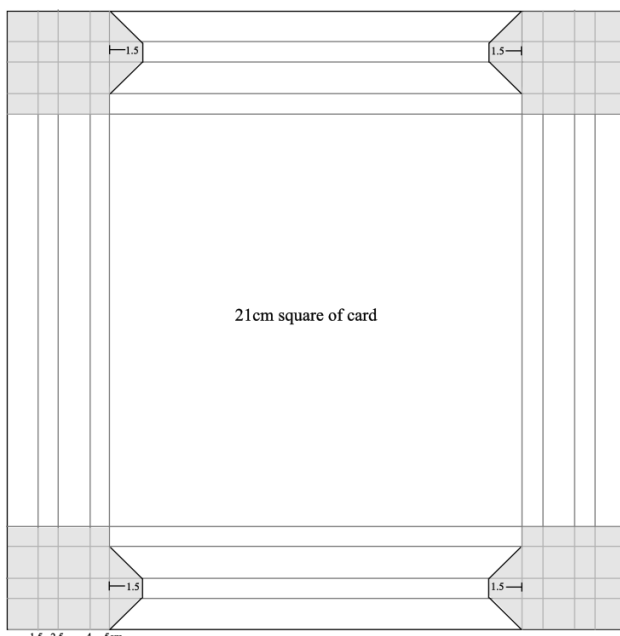
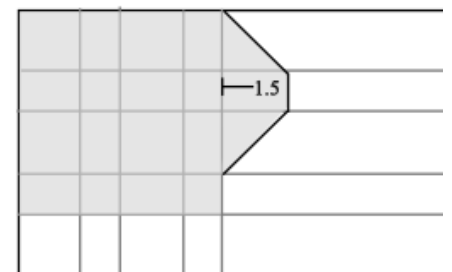
Cut your card into a square or a rectangle, depending on which you want to make, in this example I have worked with a square piece.

With your pencil & ruler measure four borders around the edges of your card: 1.5; 2.5; 4 & 5cm, or in Imperial that would be $\frac{9}{16}$; 1; $1\frac{9}{16}$ & 2" approximately. Pencil in all of the lines & double check anything that doesn't look quite right.



With guidance from the diagram to the left go to the second from the edge border, on one side & make a pencil mark 1.5cm ($\frac{9}{16}$ ") in from the innermost border line, repeat at the opposite end of the same line & draw in the lines. Angle your ruler in order to draw a diagonal line

between the top of that line & the corner of the one above & then repeat to the corner of the line below. Move to the lower edge & repeat the process -the diagram below is what you are aiming for.



Next you need to score all four of the border lines before cutting away the sections that I have shadowed in each corner on the diagram to the left.

Now all you need to do is to fold & burnish the lines & then fold, carefully tucking the straight corners within the angled ones.
